The designers graduating each year and becoming part of the work force for all realms of design, textile and fashion, are enhancing the aesthetics and innovating consistently, to compete with international competition and improve the standards of local textile market.

However, having experienced a fashion revolution in the last couple of decades, the country's fashion industry has witnessed an exceptional boom, registering a staggering 79% growth in the recent years – one of the largest industrial growth rates in the world.

This fashion and brand's boom has invited great attention, both from local and international players and the country has now become home to a number of powerful fashion houses and countless exquisite local and international brands.

The overwhelming activity and growth in the fashion industry has also had a significant impact on the country's economy. It is not just the clothing, shoes and accessories but also the creative activities linked with the fashion industry including work of designers, creative directors, fashion photographers, stylists and marketers, forming a major part of the country's services sector.

Export market is also starting to develop as more and more Pakistani brands created by educated designers are showcasing their products in markets like UK, US, Canada and UAE.

Craftsmanship of Pakistan (Part A)





Karachi is mostly considered as a hub for Hand-weaving artisans which create hand-weaved jacquard designs enriching the entire production of the fabric, moreover Karachi consists of Handembroidery artisans as well. As Karachi is the business hub of Pakistan, mostly every embroidery art is present in the city.

Sindh is full of craftsmanship, some of the art works are mentioned below: Mithi: Thari Embroidery Khairpur: Sindhi Embroidery Hala: Block-Printing Badin: Tie and Die The most famous work of Arts in this region are: Ajrak (Ancient Block Print fabric) and Ralli (Patchwork). The Punjab province of Pakistan also never fails to impress when we talk about "Fashion Crafts". The Bahawalpur region is known for it's Gota embroidery works and block-prints. While Multan holds its special place in hand embroidery such as Taarkashi, Kacha Tanka, Pakka Taanka, Shadow work and mukesh/kamdani work. Hence the province is popular for the craftsmanship of delicate embroidery.

Moving up to the Northern areas of Pakistan, comes Sawat and Chitral. Sawat is famous for its embroidery, Sharai woven shawls etc. Whereas Chitral holds its special place in creating immensely vivid embroidery works that have the potential to do wonders in the high-end fashion industry.





The Craftsmanship of Pakistan (Part B)



Pakistan is a land where artisans are not only inspired by ancestral values and driven by futuristic innovations, where skills and technology unify to make a perfect product. Our arts and articrafts are embedded in the age-old tradition of excellence while reflecting moods of the western world. Our products, therefore, exhilarate the body and elevate the soul, making the worlds of **'Beauty and the East**' synonymous to each other.

Jolaha the art of Intricate Hand-weave has been passed on to generations of our Artisans, these people migrated from the Banaras region of Indian Sub-Continent during the seperation and Independence of the nation.

These handful of artisans began working in the area of Orangi Town, Karachi as a community called "Jolaha" creating some incredible artistic designs which are only possible in hand-weave. Due to their low population this art has suffered to an extent that this art is now entered the level of extinction.

Whereas in the rural areas of Pakistan, natural dyeing is being practiced as a rare art. Ajrak one of the souvenirs of the Sindh province is also a product of Hand-block print by natural dyes.

The embroideries of Pakistan are also one of the richest forms of art in South Asia. Traditional clothing, accessories and animal embellishments embroidered by women for their families are still in use. Although the techniques, design elements and uses may be in common and are now widely being used in High-end fashion industry, many are peculiar to individual communities and distinguishable by their style, motifs and colour. The types of embroideries include: Kacha Taanka, Adda work, Tarkashi etc.
