Pakistan's Exports (JULY-DECEMBER 2019-20)

According to the provisional figures compiled by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, exports from Pakistan during July - December 2019 totaled US\$ 11,533 million against \$ 11,181 million during the corresponding period of last year showing an increase of 3.15%. Imports into Pakistan July-December 2019 totaled US\$ 23,229 million as against \$ 27,952 million during the corresponding period of last year showing a decrease of 16.90%. The balance of trade figures cumulative from July-December 2019 were US\$ -11,696 million.

The exports of services in Pakistan have registered growth of 6% during July-December 2019-20. Pakistan's trade in services volume was reported around US\$ 2.7 billion during July-December 2019 against US\$ 2.58 billion during the corresponding period of last year.

TDAP Activities (JULY-DECEMBER 2019-20)

i. Reorganization of TDAP:

According to the provisional figures compiled by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, exports from Pakistan during July–February, 2019-20 totaled US\$ 15,643 million against US\$ 15,097 million during the corresponding period of last year showing an increase of 3.62%. Imports into Pakistan during July – February, 2019-20 totaled US\$ 31,515 million as against US\$ 36,563 million during the corresponding period of last year showing a decrease of 13.81%. The balance of trade figures cumulative from July–February, 2019-20 were US\$ -15,872 million.

iii. Pakistan Africa Trade Development Conference (PATDC)

In order to enhance trade and increase outreach to major African economies, the Ministry of Commerce launched "Look Africa Initiative", which envisaged various measures to enhance trade with Africa. In 2019, the Ministry of Commerce relocated/opened six new Commercial Sections in Africa taking the total number to ten, to cover the top ten economies of Africa. Under the "Look Africa Policy initiative", MOC in collaboration with TDAP organized the Pakistan – Africa Trade Development Conference (PATDC) in Nairobi, Kenya, from 30-31 January 2020, which is first of its kind.

The objective of this initiative was to bring the businessmen from Africa & Pakistan under one roof to explore ways to enhance trade and remove trade barriers. The PATDC comprised of two parts the conference and the B2B meetings, which was to facilitate interactions of Pakistani delegates with African buyers through dedicated collaborative endeavors. business to business meetings were scheduled on the 30th and 31st of January 2020 at the Kenyatta International Convention Centre (KICC). From Pakistan, eighty-nine (89) companies across the following sectors participated in the B2B sessions and More than two hundred and forty-six (246) African delegates from across 26 countries African countries took part in B2B meetings with their counterparts from Pakistan.

iv. Pakistan Turkey Business Forum

On the auspicious occasion of the visit of the President of the Republic of Turkey His Excellency Recep Tayyip Erdogan, the Ministry of Commerce and Trade Development Authority of Pakistan organized Pakistan Turkey B2B Networking Session on 13th February, 2020 at the Kehkashan Hall of Serena Hotel in Islamabad. The objective of this initiative was to bring the businessmen from Turkey & Pakistan under one roof to explore ways to enhance trade and investment. B2B

matchmaking was organized between 58 Turkish companies and approximately 200 Pakistani counterparts including representatives of FPCCI.



IMPACT OF CORONA VIRUS PANADEMIC ON EXPORTS OF PAKISTAN

The coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic has had a huge, catastrophic, impact globally and on economies of almost all countries. Pakistan's economy had been showing slowing signs since mid-2018. Estimates for the current fiscal year FY20 GDP growth rate before the coronavirus struck were a mere 1.8 to 2.2 percent and in January and February 2020. The inflation rate was in the range of 14 percent with food inflation around 23 percent.

Exports from Pakistan during July–February (2019-20) showing an increase of 3.62% as compare to the corresponding period of last year. Exports in the month of February 2020 was US\$ 2.1 billion against US\$ 1.97 billion showing an increase of 13%. However, Pakistan's exports showing decline of 5% in the month of March 2020. Below table shows month wise trends of Pakistan during first nine month of fiscal year 2019-20 and its comparison with the corresponding period of 2018-19.



Projections:

Pakistan's economy is projected to face a loss of up to 4.64% of its gross domestic product (GDP) due to disruptions in trade caused by the lockdown imposed in provinces due to the outbreak of coronavirus. The loss was projected by the Pakistan Institute of Development Economics (PIDE). In the first case, GDP will contract 0.30% in case imports reduce by 2%. In the second scenario, GDP may contract 2.3% due to a reduction in imports and exports by 10%. In the last scenario, that GDP will contract 4.64% if the reduction in imports and exports is up to 20%. However, in the second scenario, a 10% decline in intermediate and capital goods is likely to bring a major fall in investment as well as a similar reduction in exports, which would result in a loss of 2.3% of GDP in the fourth quarter of FY2020. A 20% decline in export and import is estimated in the third scenario and the GDP loss would be 4.6%.

The major trading partners of Pakistan with substantial export share include China, USA, UK and Germany. These are the worst-hit countries by COVID-19. There have been significant disruptions in international trade flows of these countries. The USA and China are the major importing partners and we heavily rely on them for the import of capital and intermediate goods. These raw materials are then utilized in the production of final goods for exports and domestic consumption. Similarly, being our major export partners, any economic downturn to these economies may face, would directly affect our exports as well as our GDP.
