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## **Executive Summary**

Pakistan and China are members of World Trade Organization (WTO) since 1st January 1995 and 11 December 2001, respectively. Pakistan and China have strong economic and trade relationship in the region. The Free Trade Agreement (FTA) of Pakistan and China is significant on several levels. Primarily, it establishes the long-lasting trade association among Pakistan and China. From the last decades, both countries have remained significant trade partners. Both nations have been involved in different FTAs with other economies as well. China maintains 16 Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) with its trade and investment partners and is negotiating or implementing an additional eight FTAs. China's FTA partners are ASEAN, Singapore, Pakistan, New Zealand, Chile, Peru, Costa Rica, Iceland, Switzerland, Maldives, Mauritius, Georgia, Korea, Australia, Hong Kong, and Macao. While Pakistan maintains three FTAs with its trade partners - China, Malaysia and Sri Lanka.

The Phase-1 of CPFTA was signed on 24th November 2006 and became operational in November 2007. Nevertheless, there has been little improvement to attain the benefits from Pakistan-China FTA. It was observed at different fora for providing preferential access of Chinese products into Pakistan. The local industry of Pakistan also raised concerns on various occasions regarding Pakistan-China FTA. In this scenario, it was important to scrutinize the impact of Pakistan-China FTA on the national economy and identify the sectors wherein an elimination of trade tariff might result in mutual benefit and maximization of return from this FTA. In this regard, Government of Pakistan started negotiations for Pakistan China Free Trade Agreement Phase -II from 2012. The Phase-II of CPFTA was concluded in April 2019 in China.

The implementation of CPFTA-II started from January 2020. Under Phase-II, Pakistan has secured enhanced and deeper cooperation on products of its export interest, revision of safeguard mechanism for protection of the domestic industry to maximum 23 years against the import surge, inclusion of the Balance-of-Payment clause as a safety valve against balance of payment difficulties and an effective enforcement of the electronic data exchange in order to avoid misdeclaration and under invoicing of trade shipments.

Under CPFTA Phase-II, China will immediately eliminate tariff on 313 tariff lines of Pakistan's export interest, giving treatment at par with ASEAN. These 313-tariff lines cover over US\$ 8.7 billion worth of Pakistan's global export and US\$ 64 billion of worth of Chinese global imports. In terms of complete offer by China, over US\$ 19 billion of Pakistan's export will be covered, which corresponds to US\$ 1.6 trillion of the Chinese global imports. Major product lines included in CPFTA phase-II are: textile and garments, seafood, meat and other animal products, prepared foods, leather and chemical plastic, oil seeds, footwear as well as engineering goods including tractors, auto parts, home appliances, machinery etc.

Increase in sensitive list (with no concession) from 10% to 25% which comes to 1760 tariff lines and covers 37% of Pakistan's imports from China which give fair amount of market projection to Pakistani domestic industry from imports from China. Major protected industries include textile and clothing, iron and steel, auto, electrical equipment, agriculture, chemical, plastic, rubber, paper and paper board, ceramics, glass and glassware, surgical instruments, footwear, leather, wood, article of stones and plaster, and miscellaneous goods.

This research highlights export trends during one year at HS 08 digit. Unfortunately, Covid-19 also started during the implementation period of CPFT Phase-II. The trends and insight will be clearer in late 2021 as the impact of COVID-19 is gradually subsidizing the man vaccination process in Pakistan.

It is pertinent to mention that we have used custom data (Electronic Data Exchange) of different ports where export to China is recorded under FTA.

## China Pakistan Free Trade Agreement

#### 1. Introduction:

Pakistan is a developing economy and facing many economic challenges. Nevertheless, it has significant strategic geoeconomics condition in the world. Pakistan can improve its economic condition through Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) because FTA facilitate the free flow of trade and investment and bring closer economic integration between the binding parties by eliminating tariff restrictions on each other's commodities. Pakistan's economy is striving to resolve trade imbalance and lack of investment for several years. However, economic losses have been reported due to consistent changes in the economic policies. Amongst several initiatives, China Pakistan Free Trade Agreement is an example of improvement towards economic recovery. Resultantly, China has now become the third-largest trading partner of Pakistan.

During last three decades, it has been observed that China's GDP is rising at a substantial rate. China's GDP was US\$ 9.24 trillion in 2013 and now China is among the world's fastest growing economies with its second-largest nominal GDP at US\$ 14.34 trillion. China registered GDP growth was 6.7% in 2019 and GDP per capita stood at US\$ 10,262 in 2019. China's trade share a huge portion of the world economy. The country has achieved remarkable development in international trade and investment. Currently, China is one of the world's major exporting economies. China is the biggest trading nation holding top position in world exports at US\$ 2.6 trillion and second largest importer of goods with US\$ 2.1 trillion. China's trade potential with its humongous market size, growth rate, consumption capacity and commercial infrastructure makes it one of the most favorable export destinations for Pakistani products.

Trade relations between Pakistan and China that took a leap in 1950s could only translate into real development with the start of last decade. Pakistan and China had signed six MOUs on trade relating to mining, tele-communication, tourism, and railroad infrastructure. In December 2004, further 7 MOUs in the areas of trade, communication and the energy sector were signed; and then in 2005, 21 agreements and MOUs on energy, infrastructure, and

social sector were also agreed upon. Later on, an Early Harvest Program further wired both countries into trade and paved way for the Free Trade Agreement signed on 24 November 2006 titled as "China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement (CP-FTA)". It was generally observed at different fora for increasing trade deficit with China and for providing more preferential access to Chinese exports into Pakistan. In this regard, Government started negotiation for Pakistan China Free Trade Agreement Phase -II since 2012. The Phase-Il of CPFTA was concluded in April 2019 in China. The implementation of CPFTA-II started from January 2020.

The research critically examines one year performance of second phase of Pak China Free Trade Agreement specifically 313 highly prioritized tariff lines. Detailed analysis will help us understand Pak-China bilateral trade under CPFTA-II, impact of tariff reduction and to explore avenues to get better share of Chinese market through this Agreement.

### 2. Pakistan-China Bilateral Trade Overview

China is our 2nd largest export destination with exported value US\$ 1.8 billion following United States of America (US\$ 4.14 billion) in 2020. Bilateral trade between Pakistan and China comprises bulk of imports from China and partly explains huge trade deficit standing around US\$ 10.6 billion in 2020. Imports of Pakistan from China reported by Trade Map for the year 2020 stand at US\$ 12.5 billion and witnessed a steadily declining trend from last five years. Pakistan's exports increased from nearly US\$ 575 million in 2006 to around US\$ 1.8 billion in 2020. On the other hand, imports from China increased from around US\$ 3.00 billion in 2006 to nearly US\$ 12.4 billion in 2020, exhibiting an increase of almost US\$ 10 billion.

## 3. Early Harvest Program (EHP)

Before formally signed any FTA, Pakistan and China signed an agreement to enforce Early Harvest Programme (EHP) for reducing tariff on around 3,000 industrial and agriculture products from Jan 1, 2006. Under the EHP, the two countries received tariff reduction on about 3,000 items, in three phases, till January 2008. In the first phase, the Chinese side brought down the excise duty to zero on 769 mutually agreed products that include vegetables, fruits, marble material and cotton fabrics. Similarly, the Pakistani side reduced the tariff to zero on 486 items, which include textile machinery and chemicals. The EHP consists of two lists of items — Common List and Separate List — for bringing customs duty to zero on certain items, even prior to the conclusion of the Free Trade Agreement (FTA).

It also covered the items, on which, the two countries are already giving tariff concession under Preferential Tariff Agreement (PTA). On average, there were 27 percent concession in duties from the Chinese side in the first phase, while it will be 22 percent reduction in duties from the Pakistani side. The agreement was followed by bilateral talks held between the two countries and conclusion of second round of negotiations on FTA.

Early Harvest Program (EHP) was basically a mini fast track initiative leading up to the signing of Pak-China FTA in the following year which was regarded to be a win-win strategy for both the parties. Products with major commercial interests gained superior market

access from both the countries. However, many products were approved to be exportable from either side at Margin of Preference, in relation to MFN duty rate. Hence, this allowed Pakistan and China to take advantage of reduced duty rates as compared to the exports of the similar products from other countries. Pak-China FTA's first phase included Trade in Goods and Investments, while negotiations regarding Trade in Services took place in 2007, to expand the coverage of the mutual agreement. EHP was merged into the bilateral agreement (FTA) signed between Pakistan and China and in the overall package. Pakistan got market access on the products at zero duty namely, cotton fabrics, industrial alcohol, marble and other tiles, bed-linen and other home textiles etc.

## 4. China Pakistan Free Trade Agreement Phase - I

Pakistan and China are close friends, and they have excellent strategic link for many decades with each other. China always takes keen interest in development of Pakistan's industry technology, and infrastructure. Pakistan China – FTA is golden opportunity for Pakistan towards enhancing its overall trade development. Pakistan signed an FTA with China on 24th November 2006, which came into effect in 2007. In phase-I, China abolished tariffs on 6418 product lines and similarly Pakistan also eliminate/decrease tariffs on 5686 product lines within 5 years. The phase-I of CPFTA ended in December 2012.

The overall package of Pakistan and China included the provision of market access at zero duty to Pakistan in products like cotton fabrics, bed-linen, leather articles, sports goods, mangoes, other fruits and vegetables etc. China also reduced its tariffs by 50% on products like frozen orange juices, rubber and plastic products, fish, dairy sector, woven garments, knitwear etc. on the other hand, Pakistan gave market access to China mainly on products like fruits and vegetables, raw materials for several industries like engineering sector etc.

China reduced tariffs on 6,418 8-digit tariff lines, giving market access to Pakistan on products like industrial alcohol, home textiles, bed linen, and sports goods, fruits, vegetables steel, iron and engineering products. Out of the tariff lines granted, 35% came under zero-rated category (from 5 years since the FTA comes into effect in 2007); products covered under this category were cotton fabrics, medical appliances, leather articles etc. On the other hand, 15% of products received no grant that include cotton, paper, fish, textile products etc.

The grants in tariff lines provided by Pakistan to its most important trade and strategic partner include reduction or elimination of tariff rates on 5,686 8-digit tariff lines. Electronic appliances, machinery and several categories of raw materials essential to the industrial sector of Pakistan were granted zero tariff rates. But many products such as woven fabrics, paper, synthetic fibers, paper board and footwear received no concession.

As a result of CPFTA-I, the bilateral trade reached to approximately US\$ 14 billion at the end of 2020 as compared to US\$ 3.4 million in 2006 prior to the FTA being executed. However, the imports of Pakistan from China increased substantially as compared to the exports of the country to China. Since July 2013, CPFTA phase-II negotiations were initiated between both countries.

### 5. CPFTA Phase - II

Government of Pakistan started negotiation for Pakistan China Free Trade Agreement Phase -II since 2012. The Phase-ll of CPFTA was concluded in April 2019 in China. The implementation of CPFTA-II started from January 2020. Under Phase-ll, Pakistan has secured enhanced and deeper cooperation on products of its export interest, revision of safe guard

mechanism for protection of the domestic industry to maximum 23 years against the import surge, inclusion of the Balance-of-Payment clause as a safety valve against balance of payment difficulties and an effective enforcement of the electronic data exchange in order to avoid misdeclaration and under voicing of imports.

Under CPFTA Phase-Il China immediately eliminated tariff on 313 tariff lines of Pakistan's export interest, giving treatment at par with ASEAN. These 313 tariff line cover over US\$ 8.7 billion worth of Pakistan's global export and US\$ 64 billon of worth of Chinese global imports. ### 6. Different Clauses Under the CPFTA-II Framework

Under the Phase-II, Pakistan has secured enhanced and deeper concessions on products of its export interests, revision of safeguards mechanism for protection of the domestic industry, inclusion of the balance of payment clause as a safety valve against balance of payments difficulties, and effective enforcement of the electronic data exchange.

The major features of the agreement in Phase-II inter-alia include:

#### 6.1 Market Access:

Under the Phase-II of CPFTA, both countries will liberalize 75% of tariff lines for each other in a period of 10 years by China and 15 years by Pakistan. China will immediately eliminate tariffs on 313 most priority tariff lines of Pakistan's export interest. Overall, China has granted concessions to products which include textiles and garments, seafood, meat and other animal products, prepared foods, leather, chemicals, plastics, oil seeds, footwear as well as engineering goods including tractors, auto parts, home appliances, machineries, etc.

Pakistan has offered market access to China on raw materials, intermediate goods and machineries. Access to cheaper imported inputs and machinery will improve Pakistan's export competitiveness and help upgrade its industrial production.

#### 6.2 Protected Tariff Lines:

25% of tariff lines i.e., 1760 TLs have been placed in the protected list for Pakistan. The major protected industry includes textiles and clothing, iron and steel, auto, electrical equipment, agriculture, chemicals, plastics, rubber, paper and paper board, ceramics, glass and

glassware, surgical instruments, footwear, leather, wood, articles of stones and plaster, and miscellaneous goods.

## 6.3 Safeguard Measures:

Safeguard Measures (SGM) are invoked to temporarily restrict imports of a product which cause injury or threaten to cause injury to the domestic industry. The existing SGM, in CPFTA were inadequate to address the concerns of the industry and have lapsed since these could only be invoked during the transition period i.e. 2007-12. Following modifications have been incorporated in the Agreement:

- In Phase-I SGM were limited to the absolute increase in imports, but now can be invoked on relative increase in imports as well.
- The transition period has been increased to 10 years for Category-I and 8 years for the remaining tracks, which in relation to Tariff Reduction Modality will be 15 years for CAT-II & 23 years for Category-III.
- SGMs can be applied for 3 years, and can be extended to an additional 2 years. This has not been granted to any other country by China.
- In Phase-I SGM, injury to the industry had to be proven but an emergency measure of 180 days can be imposed in Phase-II without proving injury.

#### 6.4 Electronic Data Exchange:

In order to avoid misdeclaration and under-invoicing of imports from China, a system of Electronic Data Exchange has been enforced on the trade taking place under the framework of the Free Trade Agreement

#### 6.5 Balance of Payment

Balance-of-Payment clause was included as a safety valve against balance of payment difficulties and to forestall the imminent threat of a serious decline in monetary reserves

## **Tariff Reduction Modality in CPFTA-II (for Pakistan)**

Tariff lines of China at 8 digit were 8,238 in 2018. China did not import on 1035 tariff lines (13 per cent of the 8238 TL) from the world. On the remaining 87 per cent of product codes, tariffs range from 0 to 65 per cent. China has given immediate duty-free access on 3707 lines (45 per cent of total tariff lines). A further 30 per cent of tariff lines will have duty-free access by 2030. Tariffs on 412 lines will be reduced by 20 per cent in five years, while tariffs will remain at base year (2013) rates for 1867 tariff lines (or 20 per cent of the tariff lines)

## 7. Categories

- 7.1 A-0 customs duties on originating goods provided for in category "A-0" in the Schedule shall be eliminated entirely and such goods shall be free of customs duty on the date this Protocol enters into force
- 7.2 A-7 customs duties on originating goods provided for in category "A-7" in the Schedule shall be removed in 6 equal annual stages beginning on year 2, and such goods shall be free of customs duty, effective January 1 of year seven
- 7.3 A-15 customs duties on originating goods provided for in category "A-15" in the Schedule shall be removed in 12 equal annual stages beginning on year 4, and such goods shall be free of customs duty, effective January 1 of year fifteen
- 7.4 MOP1 customs duties on originating goods provided for in category "MOP1" in

- the Schedule shall be reduced by twenty percent of the base rates on the date this Protocol enters into force:
- 7.5 MOP2 customs duties on originating goods provided for in category "MOP2" in the Schedule shall be reduced by twenty percent of the base rates on January 1 of 2022;
- 7.6 C1 customs duties on originating goods provided for in category "C1" in the Schedule shall remain at base rates.
- 7.7 C2 customs duties on originating goods provided for in category "C2" in the Schedule shall not be subject to any tariff concession.
- 7.8 The base rate of customs duty and category for determining the interim rate of 2 customs duty at each stage of reduction are indicated for the item in the Schedule.
- 7.9 Reduced rates shall be rounded at least to the nearest tenth of a percentage point or, if the rate of duty is expressed in monetary units, at least to the nearest Pakistan Rupee in the case of Pakistan. 6. For the purposes of this Section and the Schedule, year one means the year this Protocol enters into force. 7. For the purposes of this Section and the Schedule, beginning in year two, each annual stage of tariff reduction shall take effect on January 1 of the relevant year.

## 8. Tariff Description of 313 Tariff Lines & Utilization Rate

These products are those which include in Pakistan's List of 313 High Priority Tariff lines to get Immediate Tariff Elimination from China. The complete list is attached at Annexure-I. As per initial analysis, it is found that from 313 items, only 60 tariff lines are being utilized under CPFTA-II

## 9. Quantitative Analysis of CPFTA-II – Utilization Rate


Bilateral trade between the two sides reached US\$ 14 billion in 2020 as Chinese exports to Pakistan declined from US\$ 15.4 billion to US\$ 12.4 billion in 2020 after implementation of CPFTA-II. Moreover, exports from Pakistan to China grew from US\$ 1.5 billion in 2017 to US\$ 1.8 billion in 2020. CPFTA Phase -II is finalized after impact assessment, and consultation with public and private-sector stakeholders between 2016 and 2019. Pakistan expressed dissatisfaction over the lopsided outcome of the FTA phase-I, highlighting unequal gains due to erosion of the margin of preference. CPFTA Phase-II is independent of phase-I and based on the principle of "less than reciprocity" in favor of Pakistan.

Pakistan also sought unilateral concessions on priority items from the Chinese side as a sign of goodwill to address the country's concerns. Apart from that, Pakistan also successfully sought revision of the safeguard measures (SGMs), which could be applied to temporarily restrict the import of a product, which caused injury or threatened to cause injury to a domestic industry.

#### 9.2 Utilization rate of CPFTA-II

Pakistan exported China through different ports. This research collected data of exports under CPFTA through EDE system. It is found that goods are exported under FTA through two ports, Port Qasim and Karachi Port. The data is analyzed thoroughly and found that limited tariff lines are exporting under the scheme. Pakistan's exports to China recorded US\$ 1.8 billion in 2020 while data of said 02 ports have shown that exports under CPFTA were US\$ 1.07 billion during the same period. It is concluded that utilization rate of the agreement is 58%.

The below table shows the Traiff lines utilized under CPFTA. Most of the Tariff lines are from Textile sector, Fish, leather and yarn. There is great potential to explore Chinese market under CPFTA.II. The Tariff lines exported through Port Qasim is reported in the below Table:

#### 9.5 Pakistan's Exports to China – via Karachi Port

The below table shows tariff utilization of CPFTA at Karachi Port. It is found that more than 325 tariff lines are utilizing under the agreement. The data shows that copper, leather, Fish, yarn, ready made garments, marble, processed food, guar gum, aluminum, grey fabric, clinkers, Talc etc. is exported under the agreement.

## 10. CPFTA – II Analysis of highly prioritized 313 Tariff Lines

This research divided highly prioritized tariff lines into broad sectors to analyze sector wise utilization rate. The data analysis for the year 2020 shows that Pakistan exported only 60 tariff lines in total from Pakistan to China from 313 tariff lines. Exports of 50 tariff lines were reported from Karachi port and 30 tariff lines from port Qasim. In total, only 60 tariff lines are utilizing by Pakistan from highly prioritized list of 313 items. Sector wise break up of 313 priority list of CPFTA-II. is calculated as below:

Exporters of Pakistan are not exporting all tariff lines having zero concession negotiated by the government of Pakistan. We need to address the issues of exporters to check the inside of the non-tariff barriers and other issues of exports related to the above-mentioned data.

## 11. Conclusion

- Exports of Pakistan to China in 2020 is term of value was recorded US\$ 1.867 Billion.
   However, exports Under CPFTA Framework (I-II) in the same year equates US\$
   1.076 billion, which is 58% of exports.
- Exports of Tariff lines under FTA from Karachi Port and Bin Qasim port highlights that negligible exports of 313 TLs were recorded under CPFTA-II 313
- Engineering Goods, 1 Jewelry and Footwear from 313 items were negligible

- In term of tariff lines, only 60 Tariff Lines are being utilized which equates to 19 percent of 313 TLs.
- Non-Tariff Barriers are the main reason for lower utilization of concession
- Proper Electronic system is not available to check the utilization rate of Trade agreement

#### 12. Recommendations

This research used Electronic Data Exchange for the year 2020 and analyzed implementation phase of CPFTA-II. Most of the tariff lines having zero access are still not utilized by Pakistani exporters. Tariff concessions are very important to get the maximum share of market access however, non-tariff barrier may also be identified/study to get the maximum benefits of this agreement. It is proposed to monitor utilization rate of CPFTA-II regularly to identify issues and revise the terms of the CPFTA-II with China if any losses occur. Few specific proposals are included to increase Pakistan's exports to China and better utilization of CPFTA-IILK.

- EDE system generation excel sheets may not be useful for the analysis. The system should be updated and may assign separate columns for each HS code. Proper columns for HS codes will provide us trade data in sequence. It will be easier for TDAP and MOC to check the utilization rate by applying simple formulas.
- A live web page/portal may be developed for the steps involved in exporting to
   China. Use of CPFTA and SPS and other import requirements of China, by tariff line.
- Trade Missions in China may be assigned to identify list of non-Tariff barriers of Highly prioritized items of Pakistan's exports to China.
- Testing and accreditation services should be available to smaller exporters who face difficulties in getting international laboratory tests.
- Better technology for efficient cargo handling. This could include laser scanners to clear time-sensitive agro- processing sector goods quickly.

•	Exports Associations and Chambers should be activated to ensure that exporters
