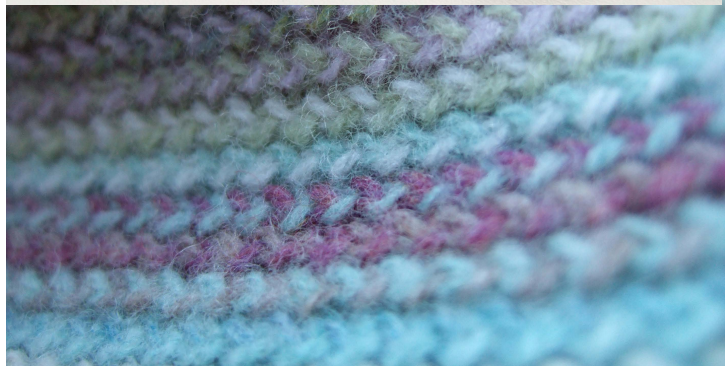

This publication is the part of efforts of TDAP to share details and showcase Pakistan's products and services in international markets.

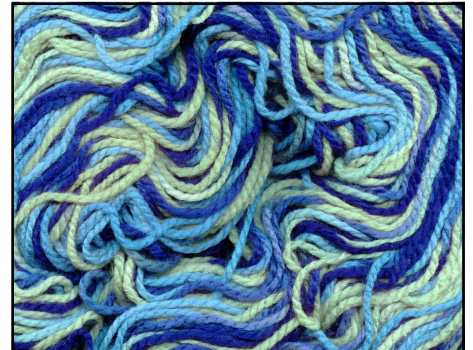
PRODUCT PROFILE + HS CODE:

Wool is the most commonly used natural protein fiber in textile industry. The product portfolio of wool is much diversified as wool can be used as a part in many textile products as intermediaries, finished textiles, knitwear, blankets, carpets and an emerging presence in technical textiles. Wool is very important for the reason that it can be used separately and as well as it enhances the unique properties of any other fiber e.g. cotton or any other natural and manmade fibers when blended with it.

PRODUCTION AREAS IN PAKISTAN:

Balochistan, Bahawalpur, tribal areas and Cholistan are the main wool producing region of Pakistan. The wool produced by this region is of carpet grade wool. KPK produces fine quality wool which is used for shawl, handicraft and cottage industry.

VARIETIES:

Wool is categorized on the basis of strength, micron, position of break, vegetable matter, color or type on animal like lamb's wool or cashmere. Generally, wool has four types that it can course, long & coarse, medium and fine.

USAGES:

Wool is used in clothing (wool insulated outer wear, active wear, tweed, blazer, velour, superior / donigal / honey shirting, byla & byma for light winter wear, shawls, services dress cloth), firefighting, blankets, carpets, curtains, upholstery/soft furnishing, bedding, insulation. Even the by-product, lanolin, has a myriad of uses from adhesive tape to auto lubrication as well as cosmetics and shampoos.

REGISTRATION AGENCIES:

The International Wool Textile Organization is the global authority for standards in the wool textile industry. There is no formal wool association registered with DGTO in Pakistan.

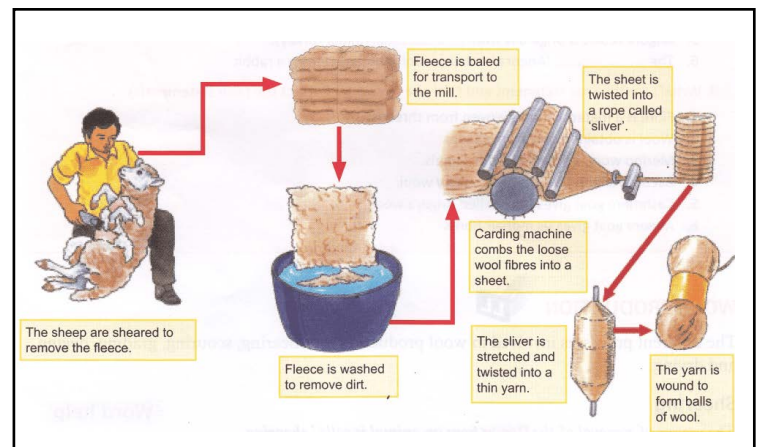
TESTING / CERTIFICATIONS:

Aside from various types of animals and breeds, several things determine the quality of wool and hair. Wool and hair are both graded on their properties such as strength, staple length (length of the fiber), and fineness (diameter measured in microns), as well as consistency and defects.

International Wool Textile Organization (IWTO) maintains the global standards for wool testing and arbitration. These are published in the IWTO Red Book, White Book, and Blue Book.

PACKAGING & STORAGE

Wool is packaged in **bales wrapped in jute, sisal or plastic** and is held together with steel strapping and/or wires.
